

St. Paul talks about this when he writes to the Romans: "Thanks be to God, though you used to be slaves to sin...you have been set free from sin." (Romans 6: 18) Likewise, St. John speaks of freedom when he says, "Jesus Christ...has set us free from our sins by his blood." (Rev. 1: 5) Because of that we are "fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God."

Yet, with our freedom from sin our Lord also gives us a great responsibility. St. Paul tells us that when he says, "You have been set free from sin and have become slaves to righteousness." God has not freed us from sin so that we might do whatever we want, whatever we think is right. He has freed us from sin so "that I might be his own and live under him in his kingdom and serve him in everlasting righteousness, innocence and blessedness." (Explanation to 2nd Article of Apostles' Creed) He has freed us from sin so that we might "take captive every thought and make it obedient to Christ." (2 Cor. 10: 5) St. Peter also talks about our freedom as Christians when he says, "Live as free men, but do not use your freedom as a cover-up for evil.; live as servants of God. Show respect to everyone! Love the brotherhood of believers, honor God, respect the king." (1 Peter 2: 16, 17)

As we once again celebrate our freedom as Americans, let us also remember the freedom which Christ has won for us sinners, also recalling that with freedom always comes responsibility and commitment.

From Sunday July 7th thru Sunday September 1st (Labor Day Weekend). . there will be one worship service at 9:15 AM.




